



What is Image & Gift?

Image & Gift is a course on Christian Anthropology based on Theology of the Body.

What is Christian Anthropology?

Christian Anthropology is the study of the human person in light of what it means that humans are made in the image of God.

How is Image & Gift different from other courses on Theology of the Body?

Image & Gift presents the actual text of St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body. As it is written, this great work can be applied to many contemporary issues facing Catholic Christians today including the meaning of being embodied as male and female, the nature of marriage, the importance of the celibate vocation, same-sex attraction, gender ideology and the relevance of the sacramental life.

Who is Image & Gift for?

Image & Gift is for any adult Catholic who wants to learn or deepen their understanding of Catholic teaching regarding the human person.

What will I get from the Image & Gift course?

Through instruction, demonstrations, discussions and problem-solving, participants will learn what the Catholic Church teaches regarding what it means to be embodied as male and female, dive more deeply into Catholic teaching on marriage and celibacy and how these relate to the nature and purpose of the human person. Contemporary issues facing Catholics will also be explored such as, contraception, same-sex attraction, gender theory, and the relevance of the sacramental life.

How much does the course cost and what do I get?

The cost of this course is \$150, however, to ensure anyone can participate, a donation of your choice is acceptable if you are unable to afford the course fee. The fee will cover the cost of materials including two textbooks, use of facilities and other expenses related to putting on the course. Employees & volunteers with the Diocese of Baton Rouge will have the opportunity to earn advanced credit in Catholic Sexual Morality.
